

Valuable Skills for an At-Sea Processor


- oTeam player

Processing At-Sea Precautions

- Get a written contract
 - These will generally be for 3 to 4 months
- Make sure the company has a good reputation
- Prepare for homesickness
- OBe prepared to complete your work contract
- OBe medically healthy
 - Pass the pre-hire physical and drug screen
- OBe prepared to work long hours in a cold, wet environment
- OBe able to lift 50 pounds
- Be able and willing to be in a zero-tolerance work environment
- \bigcirc Remember \rightarrow no fish = no work and no work = no pay




Factory Vessel Organization




Factory Vessel Organization - Bridge







Factory Vessel Organization - Engineering




Factory Vessel Organization - Galley
